A Complete Tour of Your Digital Store Platform

The Djangify eCommerce Builder (aka eBuilder) is a Django-based eCommerce platform built specifically for selling digital products. Think of it as a self-hosted alternative to platforms like Gumroad or Shopify, but without the ongoing platform fees eating into your revenue and without a corporation controlling your business.

Let's walk through exactly what's included.

The Shop System

At its core, eBuilder handles everything you need to sell digital products. Product listings with descriptions, images, and pricing. Secure checkout powered by Stripe. Automatic digital delivery once payment completes. Customer accounts where buyers can access their purchases anytime.

This isn't a basic file download system bolted onto a blog. It's purpose-built for digital commerce, handling the complete flow from discovery to delivery.

The Page Builder

Your store needs more than just product pages. The page builder lets you create any page your site requires using a block-based system. Hero sections for impactful introductions. Image galleries to showcase your work. FAQ blocks for common questions. Three-column layouts for feature comparisons. Content sections for detailed information.

You build pages by combining these blocks through the admin interface – no coding required. Each page can have its own layout while maintaining consistent styling across your site.

The Blog System

Content marketing remains one of the most effective ways to attract customers. eBuilder includes a full blog system with a TinyMCE editor for rich content creation. Categories and tags for organisation. SEO-friendly URLs and metadata. Schema.org markup for search engines.

Your blog posts live alongside your store, driving traffic and establishing authority in your niche.

The Info Pages System

Some content doesn't fit neatly into blog posts or the page builder. Info pages handle standalone content like about pages, contact information, terms of service, and privacy policies. Simple, straightforward pages that every business needs.

The Admin Interface

Behind everything sits a modern admin panel built with Adminita, a custom Django admin theme. This is where you manage products, process orders, create content, and configure your store. It's designed to be intuitive without sacrificing power.

What This Means for Your Business

When you choose the self-hosted option, you receive all of this – the complete source code, every app, full documentation. You deploy it on your infrastructure, customize it to your needs, and own it outright. There are no monthly platform fees, no transaction percentages, no restrictions on what you can sell or how you can modify the software.

For managed hosting customers, you get full access to use all these features through our hosted service. Your store runs on our infrastructure with all updates and maintenance handled for you. However, managed hosting is a service subscription – you are using the platform, not downloading the software. If you later decide you want complete ownership and the ability to run eBuilder yourself, you can upgrade to self-hosted and take your database with you, ensuring a seamless transition.

This distinction matters: self-hosted means you own the software; managed means you are paying for us to run it for you.

Sell Globally from Day One – Multi-Currency Support

Your store displays prices in your chosen currency throughout the entire customer journey – from product listings through checkout to order confirmations. There's no awkward currency switching or confusion about what customers are actually paying.

Why This Matters

This isn't just about convenience. Studies consistently show that displaying prices in a customer's local currency increases conversion rates. People are more likely to complete a purchase when they immediately understand the price without calculation.

Stripe Handles the Complexity

Behind the scenes, Stripe processes payments in your configured currency. You receive payouts in your local currency based on your Stripe account settings, with Stripe handling any necessary conversions. This means you can sell in USD to American customers while receiving GBP into your UK bank account, or vice versa.

The platform handles the display; Stripe handles the money movement. You focus on selling products.

Choosing Your Currency

When setting up your Djangify store, you select your primary currency. This applies across your entire store – all products, the basket, checkout, and order records use this currency consistently.

If your primary market is the United States, configure for USD. Targeting Australian creatives? Set up in AUD. Selling mainly to UK customers? GBP makes sense.

The decision typically comes down to where most of your customers are located. Price in the currency they expect to see.

International Business, Local Feel

Whether you're a UK-based creator selling courses to Americans, a Canadian designer offering templates to a global audience, or an Australian developer distributing software worldwide, Djangify adapts to your market.

Selling Digital Products Without Platform Fees – How eBuilder Works

If you are selling ebooks, courses, templates, software, music, or any other digital product, you have probably noticed something frustrating about existing platforms: they all want a cut of your sales.

Gumroad takes a percentage. Shopify charges monthly fees plus transaction fees. Etsy takes listing fees and transaction fees. The more successful you become, the more you pay.

eBuilder takes a different approach.

The Ownership Model

With self-hosted eBuilder, you pay once for the software and then it's yours. No monthly platform fees. No percentage of each sale. No arbitrary restrictions on what you can sell or how much you can earn.

Your payment processing goes directly through your own Stripe account. Stripe's fees are unavoidable – they process the actual card transactions – but you are not paying an additional platform layer on top.

If you sell a £50 digital product, you keep what Stripe doesn't take for processing. There's no eBuilder fee added on top.

How Digital Delivery Works

When a customer purchases a digital product, several things happen automatically. Stripe processes the payment and confirms success. eBuilder records the order

against the customer's account. Download links become available in the customer's account dashboard. The customer receives confirmation via email with access instructions.

Downloads are tied to customer accounts, not one-time links. Your customers can return and re-download their purchases whenever they need to. You can update product files and existing customers automatically get access to the new versions.

Managing Your Products

Adding a digital product is straightforward. Upload your file through the admin interface. Add your product title, description, and images. Set your price. Publish.

You can create product variations, bundle multiple files together, or sell individual items. The system handles file storage, access control, and delivery – you focus on creating products worth selling.

Why This Matters for Your Bottom Line

Let's do simple maths. Say you sell 100 products at £20 each. That's £2,000 in revenue.

On a platform taking 10% plus payment processing, you might lose £200 to the platform and another £50–60 to Stripe. You keep roughly £1,740.

With self-hosted eBuilder, you pay only Stripe's processing fees. You keep approximately £1,940–1,950.

That's an extra £200 in your pocket from just £2,000 in sales. Scale that to £20,000 in annual sales and you are keeping an extra £2,000 per year. The numbers only become more significant as your business grows.

Managed Hosting as a Starting Point

Not ready to manage your own server? Our managed hosting service lets you start selling immediately. You get all the features without the technical overhead.

This is a genuine service subscription – we host your store, handle updates, manage security, and keep everything running. You are paying for that ongoing service, not purchasing the software to download and run yourself.

When your business grows and you are ready to take full control, you can transition to self-hosted. Your products, customers, and order history come with you. The database you have built transfers to your own infrastructure, and then you own and operate everything yourself.

But remember: managed hosting is paying for a service; self-hosted is purchasing software you own and operate. They serve different needs at different stages of business growth.

Self-Hosted or Managed Hosting – Finding the Right Fit for Your Business

This is the question everyone asks, and the honest answer is: it depends on where you are right now and where you want to be. Let's break down both options clearly so you can make an informed decision.

Self-Hosted: Complete Ownership

When you choose the self-hosted eCommerce builder, you are purchasing the complete software package. You receive the full source code, all applications, documentation, and the right to deploy it on any server you control.

This means you handle your own hosting (a VPS from providers like Hetzner, or similar typically costs £5–20 per month depending on your needs). You are responsible for server maintenance, updates, and security. You have complete freedom to modify the code, add features, and change every aspect of how the platform works.

Self-hosted is right for you if:

You are comfortable with basic server administration or willing to learn. You want complete control over your platform and data. You plan to change the software beyond standard configuration. You are building a long-term business and want to eliminate recurring platform fees. You have specific hosting requirements or compliance needs.

Managed Hosting: Simplicity and Support
